Bridges 2015: Connections Between Mathematics and Art Juried Exhibition

The Towson University exhibition is a pre-cursor to the Bridges 2015 Conference, the largest interdisciplinary mathematics conference of its kind in the world, and this year hosted by the University of Baltimore. The exhibition is curated by Chris Bartlett, Director of the Art Galleries at Towson and by Bridges Coordinator, Robert Fathauer. Juried by a Bridges panel, it represents nearly 130 participants from twenty-five countries and thirty states with artworks that incorporate mathematical themes and concepts. With over 200 works a large variety of media are represented in both two and three dimensions including oil painting, digital prints, fabrics, ceramics, wood, metal, and 3-D printed sculpture.
